### FLEET RACING AT THE CLUB



Over the last 5 summer months we have enjoyed 21 weeks of exciting class racing. The standard of our Summer series is one of the highlights of our club activities. Competition between similar boats provides for some exciting moments on the water and placings in our main series have in some cases,

been determined by the very last 42<sup>nd</sup> race! The race management of 8 starts, keeping track of 60 + competitors and determining appropriate finishing laps, is a challenging feat for our Race teams ... but we manage it every week... brilliant!



This year 263 sailors

took part in our Sunday main series with 73 adding to participation in the Wadsworth handicap racing. Saturday's has seen 142 sailors take part in the afternoon handicap racing which includes 31 Juniors many of whom have been coached by experienced Sunday racers. Our club has developed &

nurtured several generations of highly skilled racers and the core of this is built around our class racing (including windsurfing). Sailing can be enjoyed in

many forms and we all love the thrill and excitement of getting on the water. The close competition involved in class racing can bring out the demon's in some of us and on



occasions we need to remind ourselves it's all a bit of friendly fun!..... or perhaps it's about the array of silver ware offered out at our annual awards & dinner dance (Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> Feb a date for your diaries). The fleets are nurtured



by our volunteer Fleet Captains – who are ever keen to help you grow within a fleet or even try and entice you into the fold. #### Club Calendar

The full programme of sailing and training events events was reviewed and approved for 2017, these are being loaded onto Sailing Club Manager.

#### Winter Open Event - County Cooler - 11/12th Feb

We intend to hold a two day open meeting in February 2017 - currently has the working title of "The County Cooler". It is hoped that this will form a mini series with a similar event being held by Staunton Harold SC "The Staunton Blaster" with the results from both events counting towards an overall prize.

#### **Inner Distance Mark**

Many moons ago, the sailing committee recommended that the IDM should no longer be deployed as it was largely unnecessary and had a tendency to cause confusion. Whilst there are occasions where the IDM has its use -eg marking the gate when the committee boat needs to be moved to another finish mark or to finish a pursuit race - it has been decided to remove the IDM from the lake thus taking away the temptation to use it when it is really not needed. It will be prominently positioned on the bank so if any RO's feel that they will need it then it can be picked up by a RIB and positioned as required. We do ask though that if used, please remove it again after use and put it back where you found it.
